About This Service

We are delighted to welcome to the Chapel of the Transfiguration the candidates for confirmation, together with their families and friends, for this Service of Confirmation. We rejoice with them at this important step in their journey of faith.

Baptism marks the beginning of a life with God, a response to his love in Christ. It is a joyful moment as candidates, parents, godparents, and sponsors give thanks, make promises, and declare their faith, surrounded by the support and prayers of the wider Church community. It also gives us all the chance to remember our own baptism and reflect on our calling as Christians.

In this service we are reminded of the signs of our faith: the cross of Christ, water that speaks of dying to sin and rising to new life, and light that conquers darkness. Confirmation is the moment when those who have been baptized affirm their faith for themselves, and the bishop, through prayer and the laying on of hands, asks God to strengthen them with the gift of the Holy Spirit, that they may live as faithful disciples of Christ.

Order of Service

The Confirmands, together with the Clergy and the Bishop of Colombo, gather at the West Door.

The Congregation stands as the Cross appears from the West End of the Chapel.

The Bishop of Colombo says,

“In Samaria, the Spirit had not come upon them; they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then Peter and John laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.”

Acts 8: 16-17

Blessed be God

Blessed be God’s reign forever. Amen.

The candidates say,

Having had instructions in the faith we who have been baptised as full members of the Church of God, and now having come to an age of reason, seek Holy Confirmation and reception in responsible membership of the church, and to live as authentic disciples of Jesus Christ.

The Bishop continues,

Sisters and brothers, by God’s own initiative and grace in Christ, through the sign of baptism and in the power of the Holy Spirit we become God’s people, the Church. Today, of your own free will, you will publicly renounce evil and profess your faith in Christ and the Holy Trinity and by the sign of the laying on of hands and anointing in Holy Confirmation; the Holy Spirit is stirred within us to strengthen us to a new life to be witnesses of Christ’s Good News.

The Chaplain and the Assistant Chaplain, present the candidates to the Bishop saying,

And so Father, we present this bread and cup in communion with your whole church, in fellowship with (Blessed Mary, and) all the saints, and in union with all creation we celebrate your Son's death and victory; giving thanks for all that Christ has done for us; for preparing us for all that lies ahead, we receive the benefits of Christ's life, death, resurrection and session in glory, and we eagerly await the heavenly banquet after Christ's coming again.

And we entreat you most merciful God to hear us and send your All Holy Spirit on us and on these your gifts, that they being blessed and hallowed by that life giving power, may be for us the Body and Blood of your most dearly loved Son, to the end that we receiving the same may be sanctified and filled with your grace and heavenly blessing.
